GRAFTED PAPER SHELL PECANS



CHEYENNE

A medium size pecan with good kernel quality. Bears heavily and at an early age. Very good for orchard plantings. Protandrous.



CHOCTAW

Nut is high in oil content, about 60% kernel, thin hull, large and attractive. This is a Mahan-Success cross. Protogynous.



DESIRABLE

Vigorous growing, disease resistant tree. Good sized, soft-shelled nut. About 55% meat. Protandrous.



KANZA

Compact, easily shelled nuts with outstanding flavor. Small-medium nut. Disease resistant. Ripens early October. Protogynous.



KIOWA

This is a Mahan-Odom cross. Nuts are large-oblong needing 45 to 50 nuts to make a pound. Bears early and heavy crops of excellent quality nuts. Protogynous.



MAHAN

The biggest Pecan grown. Looks like Western Schley, except much larger. This is an Eastern variety. A very vigorous growing tree with splendid long slender nuts. It is a first class pecan with a richly flavored kernel. The nut is about 2 1/2 inches long - average about 31 nuts to the pound. Protogynous.

OTHER VARIETIES AVAILABLE

CADDO - Regular producer with good yields, scab resistant. Protandrous.

CANDY - This beautiful tree is a consistently heavy bearer. It provides a medium sized nut early in the season. Protogynous.

CAPE FEAR - This pecan bears heavy at an early age. It is best for the southeastern states. It is scab resistant and provides an ample yield of 55 to 60 nuts per pound. Protandrous.

ELLIOT - Small, prolific nut. Excellent quality. Scab resistant. Protogynous.

FORKERT - An excellent flavored pecan. The nut is large and slender with a very thin shell. Protogynous.

JACKSON - An outstanding pecan from Southern Mississippi. About 30 nuts per pound. Very disease resistant. Protandrous.

OCONEE - Large nut. 56% kernel. Adequate disease resistance. Protandrous.

PODSEDNIK - Extra large pecan, only needing about 22 nuts to the pound. Protogynous.

Plant a mixture of Protandrous and Protogynous varieties to assure pollination.



MOHAWK

A deciduous tree that produces nuts that are large and full and of high quality. Matures early. A vigorous grower. Nuts are thin shelled. Protogynous.



PAWNEE

Large nut. Earliest maturing variety we grow. 55-62% kernel. Protandrous.



STUART

The Stuart comes nearer being suited to all sections of the country and all soils than any other variety. A large nut, fills well, medium to heavy bearer. A hardy, fast-growing tree. One of the earliest ripening of all large standard pecans. 48 percent meat. Protogynous.



SUMNER

This variety is suitable for close space planting, thus allowing more trees per acre. It is an early producer of large, high quality nuts.



HICAN

Also known as McAlester. Cross between Mahan and Hickory. A hardy tree that matures in the fall and bears prized nuts that are larger than most pecan or hickory. Pollinates with both pecan and hickory trees.

APPLES

Anna - Excellent where a low-chill apple is needed. Its fruit has a red-blush over green. It ripens in late June.

Dorsett - An excellent yellow apple for the South and Coastal areas. It is a good pollinator for the Anna apple and ripens in late June.

Ein Shemer - A self pollinator that bears large yellow apples. It matures early and bears young.

Fuji - Medium size fruit. Crisp, juicy, red with white flesh. Good keeper. Vigorous, productive, somewhat bushy tree.

Gala - One of the best tasting dessert apples. Unique crunchy crisp texture. Firm and juicy sweet mildly aromatic flesh. Ripens July thru August.

Granny Smith - Crisp, tart and juicy. One of the best cooking apples. Bright green skin. Ripens in August.

Honey Crisp™ - Red skinned. Cream colored flesh is mild, sweet and aromatic. Cold-hardy. Ripens early September.

Jonathan - Fleshy, juicy and tart; ripens late September. Red striped. Cooking or eating.

Mollie's Delicious - A wonderful summer apple well adapted to the southern states. It is an excellent pollinator, that will ripen in early August.

Pink Lady™ - Medium size, blush to pink skin. Light sweet flavor. Ripens late Oct.

Red Delicious - King of all apples; dark red in color; a sure cropper; late.

Winesap - Tangy flavor, firm, crisp, good for dessert or canning. September ripening.

Yellow Delicious - A golden yellow apple of good flavor; a good keeper. Pollinator for Red Delicious.

Early Kandailar - Considered one of the best "Old World" varieties. Has dark red fruit with a rich sweet flavor. Ripens in September.

Russian - Very cold hardy with medium to large fruit. Ripens in October. **CONT. ONLY**

Salavatski - Very cold hardy with large red fruit. Ripens in October. **CONT. ONLY**

Surh anor - Has large red fruit with a high sugar content. Consistent producer. Ripens in October. **CONT. ONLY**

Texas Pink - Has medium to light pink skin with ruby red flesh. Good for fresh eating. Cold hardy. Ripens in October. **CONT. ONLY**

Texas Red (Russian 18) - Has medium to large red fruit. The flavor is sweet with a little tartness. Does well in all areas of Texas. Ripens in October. **CONT. ONLY**

Wonderful - The most popular variety with large red fruit. it is a vigorous grower with consistent production. Ripens in October. **CONT. ONLY**



WONDERFUL POMEGRANATE

PLUMS

Allred - One of the most remarkable trees of this day and age. First a blazing shower of blossoms, followed by a crop of maroon red fruit - a maroon red on the outside with a white center. The Allred serves a two-fold purpose. First, it is a good pollinator for your yard. Second, of course, is the luscious fruit which it produces.



Bruce - Very red and productive. It is a good plum for commercial use. It is well suited to North Texas, the Panhandle and Oklahoma. Ripens about June 1st. Requires Pollinator, usually Methley.

Methley - Handsome tree; large golden red fruit. It is a very good producer. Ripens May 25th. Self-fruitful serves as excellent pollinator.

Morris - Large, red plum. Ripens in mid-June. Recent Texas A&M release. Excellent quality.

Ozark Premier - Outstanding, extra large, bright red plum.

Rubrum - Dark red skin and juicy, red flesh. Good pollinator for other plum varieties. Ripens in June.

Santa Rosa - Large, purplish crimson fruit. Delicious amber colored flesh, crimson and pink veined. Tops in quality for market and home use. Bears heavily each year. Ripens in June.

Southern Belle™ - Good sized fruit with purple skin. Firm, yellow, sweet flesh. \$0.50 Royalty, Self-fruitful.

APRICOTS

Blenheim - Oval fruit with orange or yellow flesh. Consistent bearer that ripens in late June.

Early Golden - Medium in size. Yellow, rich, juicy, and a delightful flavor. Freestone. Ripens in June.

Moorpark - Deep yellow fruit, red blush on sunny side with bright orange flesh. Freestone. Best variety for commercial purposes. Fine for canning and drying. Vigorous tree and very prolific. Fruit ripens in June. Adapted to all section of the Southwest.

Royal - Ripens mid-June. Produces well in all areas. Good size with yellow fruit.



MOORPARK APRICOT

PEARS

Ayers - A small, sweet, golden pear with an attractive red blush. The juicy smooth-textured flesh is ideal for eating fresh or canning. Ripens early; needs pollinator.

Bartlett - Large smooth yellow fruit with sweet white flesh. One of the best known and most popular pears.



MOONGLOW PEAR

Kieffer - The old standby, growing and producing in almost all areas. Hardy, robust tree. Large hard fruit, cooking type, but good quality when well ripened. Fruit is an attractive yellow. Self pollinator.

Leconte - Attractive bell shaped fruit, creamy yellow with slight blush. An excellent variety bearing consistently. Good medium-soft fruit. Vigorous, upright growing tree.

Moonglow - Best for fresh eating, good quality, ripens early summer and resistant to fire blight. A good pollinator.

Orient - Large sized fruit of good quality. Smooth shiny golden skin, tantalizing aroma and rich flavor. Vigorous, heavy bearer. Blight resistant.

Perdue™ - Large fruit with greenish skin color. Minimal chill hours. No fire blight. Fruit matures in early August. \$0.85 Royalty

Pineapple - Medium sized fruit of good quality. Heavy producer, firm and keeps well.

Warren - Long necked fruit, green with occasional red blush, medium to large size. Sweet, juicy, smooth flesh. Tree is self fruitful, resists blight even in heat and humidity.

ASIAN PEARS

20th Century - Sweet and flavorful, white flesh, self-fruitful. Ripens late August. Commercial variety.

Chojuro - Russeted fruit with aromatic flavor. Ripens mid August.

Korean giant - Golden brown globe shaped. Very crisp juicy sweet flesh with a mild spicy edge. Ripens September.

Shinko - Medium size, oval, brownish green fruit. Firm, crisp, apple-like flesh with rich, sweet, distinctive flavor. Ripens early to mid-October.

Shinseiki - Medium size, golden fruit with sweet, crisp, white flesh. Ripens late July into August. Stores well.

PEACHES

Nemaguard Rootstock - Our peaches are grown on the nemaguard rootstock which gives the trees protection against most strains of nematodes that cause damage to peach tree. Assures long life and better production for your customers. Recommended by Texas A&M University. Varieties are listed in approximate ripening order. CH for Chilling Hours.

Earligrande - Ripens from mid to late May, yellow cling. 275 CH

Floridacrest - Ripens late May, cling. 450 CH

Early Amber - Semi-freestone that ripens in early May. 250 CH

Tex Prince Patented - PP#14629 Large Commercial. 450 CH. Freestone. Ripens end of May. \$1.00 Royalty.

Rio Grande **OUT** - semi-freestone peach that ripens in early May. 450 CH

Floridaking - Yellow cling. Ripens late May. 450 CH

Tex King Patented - PP#14627 Large commercial peach. Cling. Ripens end of May. 500 to 550 CH. \$1.00 Royalty.

June Gold - Large cling. Ripens in late May or early June. 650 CH.

Sam Houston - Large yellow freestone, red colorings. Ripens June. 500 CH.

Sentinel - Large yellow semi-freestone, red skin. Ripens early June. 850 CH.

La Feliciana - Large yellow freestone. Ripens mid-June. 550 CH.

Belle of Georgia - White fleshed freestone. Ripens late June. 850 CH.

Harvest - Large yellow freestone. Ripens in late June. 700 CH.

Red Globe - Large, round, dark red skin and yellow flesh. Freestone. Ripens July. 850 CH.

Ranger - Vigorous grower, large red-yellow fruit. Ripens July. 900 CH.

Redskin - Yellow flesh with red skin. Freestone. Ripens mid-July. 750 CH

Red Haven **OUT** - Red freestone. Yellow flesh. Medium to large size. Ripens mid-CH

Red Indian - Red-fleshed, red skinned cling. Great for pickling. Ripens early July. 850 CH

Majestic - Large firm yellow freestone, red skin. Ripens end of July. 800 CH

Loring - Large yellow freestone with red blush. Ripens mid July. 800 CH

Sunprince - Yellow freestone. Ripens two days before Elberta. 800 CH

Elberta - Large yellow freestone. Ripens mid-July. Excellent quality. 850 CH.

Ruston Red - Large yellow freestone with red blush. Ripens July. 800 CH

Frank **OUT** - quality large yellow cling. Ripens August. 750 CH

Red Baron - Good fruit. Double red blooms. Ripens mid-July to mid-August. 250 CH

Crimson Cascade Weeping Peach - Crimson colored blooms with red leaves.

Bounty - Freestone, yellow flesh. 800 CH

NECTARINE

Early King - Yellow flesh, ripens early, requires 450 of low chilling hours.

Karla Rose - White fleshed freestone with red skin. Ripens in June. 500 CH

Pocahontas - A quality nectarine, with large red colored fruit. It ripens in early June and requires about 850 chilling hours.

Red Gold - Large, yellow fleshed and sweet. Self-pollinating. Needs 850 chilling hours.

Sunglo - Yellow flesh, reddish color. Chilling hours 850. Ripens mid June.

GRAPES



- Black Spanish** - Bluish-black, juicy, resistant to Pierce's Disease. Heavy producer. Aug-Sept.
Champanel - Black, seeded, resistant to Pierce's Disease. July.
Concord - Bunch and berry very large. Most reliable and profitable. Late Sept.
Fredonia - An early ripening sort with good size blue-black berries. Normally seeded. July-Aug
Himrod Seedless - A yellow fruited grape that ripens in late July.
Seibel 9110 - White, yellow, large cluster, ripens mid July. Winter hardy.
Venus - Seedless, blue color, very sweet, table grape. Mid-July



JAPANESE PERSIMMONS

- Eureka** - A very hardy variety that is best known for its consistent, heavy bearing quality. The trees bear real young. I've seen lots of very small trees in the nursery row loaded down with fruit. The tree is very attractive.
Fuyu - Large fruit, red color, rich taste, non-astringent. Ripens late October. Can be eaten before it is soft.
Hachiya - Large, flattened, excellent quality fruit. Vigorous, spreading tree is highly ornamental, has good fall color. Commercial variety, ripens late fall.
Tam-O-Pan - Oblate and very flat deep constriction near stem end, very large, skin reddish orange. Ripens November.
Tani-Nashi - This is a long bright orange Persimmon. A tree loaded with Tani-Nashi looks just like a picture. You know, Persimmon trees will hold their fruit right up until late fall or winter. Usually seedless.



- Blanc du Bois** - Award-winning white variety. Withstands heat and humidity. Great for wine-making. Mid-End July.
Lakemont - Green, seedless grape. Similar to Thompson Seedless. End August.
Niagara - Greenish yellow; flesh pulpy, sweet, voracious and prolific. Mid Sept.

- Brown Turkey** - Medium, brownish-purple; fruit very sweet; harder than Magnolia; begins to ripen last of June.
Celeste - Small to medium size. Flesh juicy, sweet, excellent quality. Hardy. July bearer.
Texas Everbearing - If you like figs, you will like this variety; beautiful yellow fruit, bears heavily throughout the season.

SHADE & ORNAMENTAL TREES



Arizona Ash - Fast growing, deciduous shade tree having handsome bright green foliage. Especially adapted to the Southwest, thriving in alkaline soils. Not immune but highly resistant to root rot. Stands wind and sun well. One of our most popular trees. **5 GALLON**

Sweet Gum - Pyramidal tree with glossy, green leaves. **OUT** 60 to 100 feet at maturity.

River Birch - A graceful pyramidal tree with slender numerous branches. It is especially noted for its torn and rugged dark brown bark. **5 GALLON**



Red Maple - Tree whose new growth is greenish throughout growing season. Excellent for shade, very red leaves in fall.



Fruitless Mulberry - Rapid growing shade tree with large dark green leaves and tannish bark. Very popular due to its non-fruiting characteristic. **OUT**

Lombardy Poplar - Tall, slender, fast growing, very hardy trees. Excellent for hedge-rows or screening. **B.R. ONLY**

Cottonless Cottonwood - An excellent shade tree that will grow well in adverse conditions. This cottonwood is fruitless and very fast growing.

Shumard Red Oak - A handsome native tree with brilliant scarlet foliage in the fall. Excellent lawn and street tree. Will grow 65 to 75 feet. **5 GALLON**

Weeping Willow - A tree with long, pendulous branches which hang to the ground. Its long, green leaves add to any landscape. 30 to 50 feet at maturity.

Mimosa - The Silk Tree has pale green, fern-like foliage, delicate and very decorative. An abundance of yellow flowers crown the branches in early summer on a fast-growing tree that may reach 30 feet in height. Its popularity is steadily growing. **OUT** 5 Gallon Only



Silver Leaf Maple - A fast growing tree, beautiful globe shape. **OUT** It will have plenty of room to develop. **5 Gallon Only**

Bald Cypress - A beautiful tree with delicate, feathery foliage. Prefers **OUT** ground but will grow anywhere. **5 Gallon Only**

Sycamore - Peeling bark which comes off in large pieces, leaving a **OUT** cream-colored trunk. The globular foliage **OUT** in all winter. A large tree, tall and impressive; widely used for street planting. **5 Gallon Only**



Redbud - A rapid growing tree with a well-shaped, rounded canopy **OUT** reaching to 20 feet in height. It blooms **OUT** ahead of the leaves. Flowers are rosy pink, pea-shaped, and they come out along the branches. **5 Gallon Only**
